

Lakehaven Water and Sewer District needs your HELP!

We are experiencing problems with the build-up of fats, oils and grease in our sewer pump station. All efforts to reduce grease, oils, and fats from going down the drain are encouraged.



Please place all cooking grease, oils, and fats into a sealed container and dispose of in the garbage or recycle at your nearest FOG recycle center



This will help to keep things flowing! It takes all of us working together to help protect and preserve our collection system and the environment!



Substances that can cause or lead to a blockage or obstruction of a sewer pipe is PROHIBITED!



Fats, Oils, and Grease are materials that are known to cause sewer blockages. You can help prevent costly and unsanitary overflows by following a few simple steps:



- Pour cooking oils and scrape grease into a non-recyclable container and dispose of in the garbage. Do not pour grease, fats, and oils down the drain!



- Place leftover foods, scraps, and fat trimmings with garbage for pick-up, not in the garbage disposal. Do not use the sewer as a means of disposing of food scraps!



- Dry wipe all pots and dishes. Use a paper towel to remove greasy leftovers from pots and dishes prior to washing in the sink or dishwasher.

Place a wastebasket in the bathroom to dispose of solid wastes. Disposable diapers and personal hygiene products do not belong in the sewer system
